DURATION : 1 DAY

TOUR ITINERARY

07:00am - Meet at lobby of Hotel, transfer to the Airport for flight to Bandar Seri Begawan, Brunei.

Meet on arrival at Brunei International Airport and proceed to the capital - Bandar Seri Begawan with visits to the Sultan Omar Ali Saifudin Mosque, the Royal Regalia Exhibition Hall, Brunei Museum, Jame Asr' Hassanal Bolkiah Mosque and a photo stop at the main entrance of the Royal Palace. Lunch at a local restaurant. After lunch transfer to the jetty to board boat for a scenic boat ride to the Water Village on the opposite side of the river.

The water village is well known as the world largest water village with houses built on stilts and home to approximate 30,000 people. Even centuries ago, the size and complexity of the Brunei water village greatly impressed the Magellan Expedition which received a stately welcome upon entering Brunei Bay in 1521. Tea / Coffee with local delicacies will be serve in a house in the Water Village.

Return to the capital city and proceed to the airport for flight back to Kota Kinabalu. Meet on arrival and transfer to hotel. End of Tour.

- **What to bring:** Insect repellent, raincoat, cap or hat and change of clothing's.
- **Package includes:** Return airport / Hotel transfers, Lunch & English speaking guide.

Do's and Don'ts When Visiting Brunei Darussalam

Bruneians are generally very tolerant and will understand that visitors are not familiar with all of their customs and Islamic traditions. Nonetheless, keeping these few things in mind will go far in showing the Bruneian people that you respect and appreciate their culture thus enriching your experience.

- Tourist should observe the local dress code and dress modestly. Clothing, comfortable for hot and humid weather is acceptable, except when visiting places of worship or for social and business functions.
- Bruneians shake hands by lightly touching the hands and then bring the hands to the chest. Some people do not shake hands with members of the opposite sex.
- You should not point with your forefinger, instead use the thumb of your right hand with the four fingers folded beneath it.
- When visiting a Mosque, all visitors must remove their shoes. Women must cover their heads and not have their knee or arms exposed. You should not pass in front of a person in prayer or touch the Koran.
- Gifts (particularly food) should only be passed with the right hand, although it is acceptable to use the left hand to support the wrists.
- It is polite to accept even just a little food and drink when offered. When refusing anything offered, it is polite to touch the plate lightly with the right hand.
- During the Islamic fasting month of Ramadan, Muslims do not take food from sunrise to sundown. It would be inconsiderate to eat or drink in their presence during this month.
- In deference to the Muslim majority, alcohol is not sold in Brunei, but private consumption by non muslims are allowed. Non Muslim tourist are allowed a generous Duty Free allowance of 2 bottles of alcohol (wine, spirits etc..) and 12 cans of beer per entry, and may consume alcohol with sensible discretion in hotels and some restaurants.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

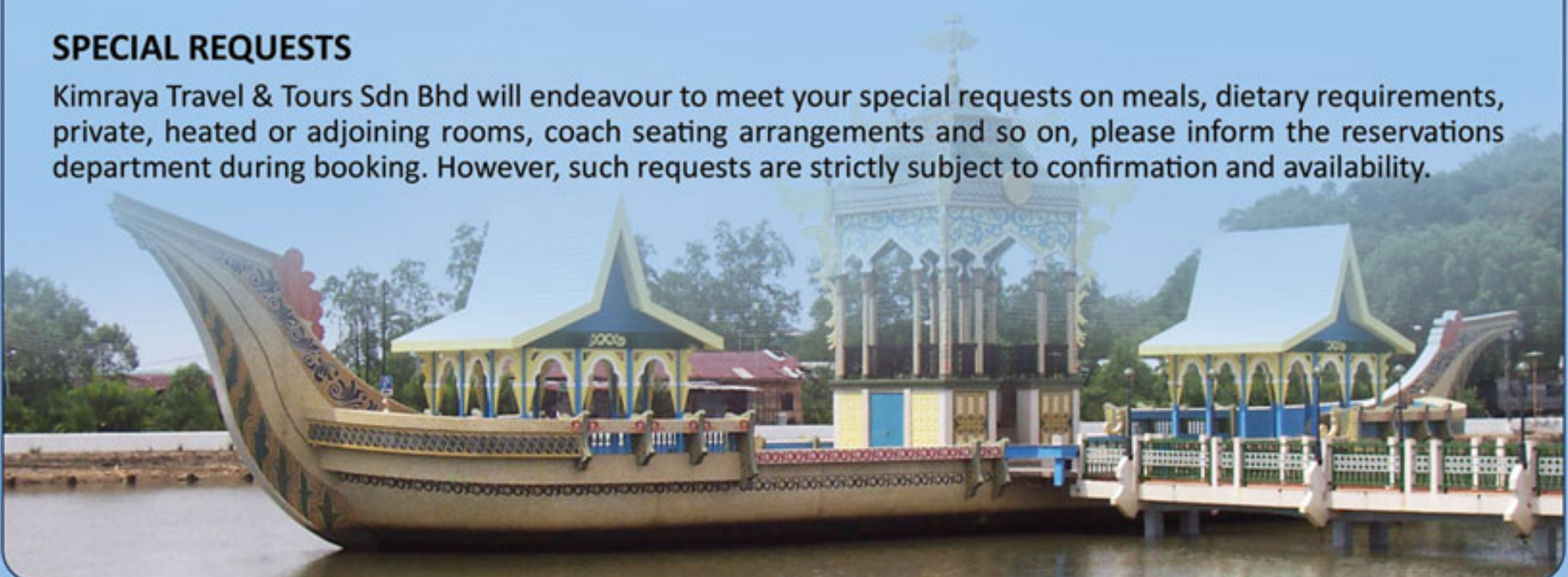
